In 2025, ratings were determined by nurse staffing, patient outcomes and whether nursing home routines included steps known to be effective in avoiding harm and improving health.

To be recognized as one of the 2025 U.S. News Best Nursing Homes, a nursing home must have been "high performing" in short-term rehabilitation metrics. Out of the 14,832 nursing homes evaluated across the country, 2,836 (19%) met those criteria, of which 2,152 were high performing in short-term rehabilitation.

Anoka Rehabilitation and Living Center continues to be a trusted resource for families in the Minneapolis metro suburbs, not only through its compassionate care, but also through its collaborative approach to physical, occupational and speech therapies.
